

## REVOLUTIONARY WAR SERVICE

**ALSOBROOK, JESSE**, aged 72, and a resident of Greene county; private N. C. Militia; enrolled on March 26, 1833, under act of Congress of June 7, 1832, payment to date from March 4, 1831; annual allowance, \$50; sums received to date of publication of list, \$100.—*Revolutionary Pension Roll*, in Vol. xiv, Sen. Doc. 514, 23rd Cong., 1st sess., 1833-34. He resided in Sumter county, June 1, 1840, aged 77.—*Census of Pensioners*, 1841, p. 149.

**ALSOBROOK, JESSE** was born Feb 20, 1762 in Halifax County, N.C. He died after JAN 1843. His burial location is unknown. **SERVICE:** He was a private in the N.C. Militia. He lived in Halifax County when he entered service. He was in skirmishes at Halifax and Eutaw Springs.

**PENSION:** Number S 16 600 - See card 1.

**RESIDENCE:** He lived in Halifax County, N.C. from birth until about twenty years after the war. Then he moved to Richmond County, N.C., lived there for eight years and then moved to Anson County, N.C. on the west side of the Pee Dee River. He moved to Greene County, Alabama in 1820 and settled about three miles from Erie where he was living in 1832. In 1840 (June 1) he was living in Sumter County and was 77 years old. There is no information about his family.
