The North East quarter of the South West quarter of Section twenty three, in Township twenty two, of Range
thirteen West, in the District of Lands Subject to Sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, containing forty
acres and three hundredths of an acre

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
chased by the said Albert Stafford

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
 several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said *Albert Stafford*
 and to *his* heirs, the said tract above described: To

Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said Albert
Stafford
 and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.
