To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Thomas B. Creel, of Pickens County
 has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Muraloosa
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Thomas B. Creel,
 according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
 the east half of the north east quarter of section twenty five, in township twenty two, of Range thirteen West, in the district of land, subject to
 sale at Muraloosa, Alabama, containing seventy nine acres, and ninety one hundredths of an acre

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Thomas B. Creel

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
 several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said

Thomas B. Creel

and to his heirs, the said tract above described:

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said
 Thomas B. Creel, and to his heirs and assigns forever.
