To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas James Bolton and Benjamin Bolton, of Pickens County
have deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said James Bolton and Benjamin Bolton,
according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
the east half of fractional Section thirty two, in Township twenty two, of range thirteen West, in the district of lands subject
to sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, containing Eighty acres and Seventy one hundredths of an acre
according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
chased by the said James Bolton and Benjamin Bolton.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said
James Bolton and Benjamin Bolton, and to their heirs, the said tract above described:
To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said
James Bolton and Benjamin Bolton, and to their heirs and assigns forever.
as tenants in common and not as joint tenants.—
