Whereas James G. Cotton, of Pickens County,  
 had deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa  
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said James G. Cotton,  
 according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for  
 the North East quarter of the South West quarter of Section thirty, in Township twenty two,  
 of Range thirteen, West, in the District of lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa, Alas-  
 =tance, containing, thirty nine acres and ninety three and a half hundredths of an acre,  
 according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-  
 chased by the said James G. Cotton.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the  
 several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said James G.  
 Cotton

and to his heirs, the said tract above described:

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said  
 James G. Cotton

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
