WHEREAS

*William Harris of Pickens County*has deposited in the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** of the United States, a Certificate of the REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE at *Tuscaloosa*

whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said

*William Harris*

according to the provisions of

the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for

*the North half of the North East quarter and East half of the North West quarter of Section twenty two, in Township twenty two, of Range thirteen West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama containing one hundred and sixty acres and six hundredths of an acre.*according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the **SURVEYOR****GENERAL**, which said tract has been purchased by the said *William Harris***NOW KNOW YE**, That the**United States of America**, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, **HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED**, and by these presents **DO GIVE AND GRANT**, unto the said *William Harris*and to *his* heirs, the said tract above described: **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said*William Harris*and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.In Testimony Whereof, I, *Martin Van Buren***PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, have caused these Letters to be made **PATENT**, and the **SEAL** of the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** to be hereunto affixed.**GIVEN** under my hand, at the **CITY OF WASHINGTON**, the *twentieth* day of *September*
