Whereas there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the

of the Register of the Land Office at Montgomery, Alabama

, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Martin Knox has been established

and duly consummated in conformity to law for the South West quarter of the North East quarter of Section twenty-eight, in Township twenty-two South of Range thirteen West of Huntsville Meridian in Alabama, containing forty acres and six hundredths of an acre

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL.

Now know ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Martin Knox the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Martin Knox and to his heirs and assigns forever. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.
