according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
The East half of the South west quarter of Section twenty five, in Township twenty two, of Range fourteen east,
in the District of Lands subject to Sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama, containing seventy seven
acres and twenty one hundredths of an acre

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
chased by the said John Addison

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said John Addison
and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To
Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said John
Addison
and to his heirs and assigns forever.
