To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, a Certificate of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, is now deposited in the Bureau of Land Management, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by George Frederick and William Robinson, according to the provisions of the Act of April 24, 1820 (3 Stat. 566), for the following described land:

St. Stephens Meridian, Alabama.

T. 23 N., R. 1 W.,

Sec. 36, SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ .

The area described contains 40.12 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres, according to the official plat of the survey of the said land, on file in the Bureau of Land Management:

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DOES GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said George Frederick and William Robinson, and to their heirs, the land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said George Frederick and William Robinson, and to their heirs and assigns forever.

This patent is issued in lieu of one dated March 30, 1837, which has been canceled because of an error in the land description.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the undersigned authorized officer of the Bureau of Land Management, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of June 17, 1948 (62 Stat. 476), has, in the name of the United States, caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the Bureau to be hereunto affixed.
