 in the District of Lands Subject to Sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, Containing Eighty acres.

 acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Thomas Reeves

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To

Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said Thomas
 Reeves, and to his heirs and assigns forever.
