To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

**Whereas,** John N. Hutton of Greene County  
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa  
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said John N. Hutton  
according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for  
The West Half of the South West Quarter of Section Twenty, in Township Twenty Three, of Range One West, in the District of Lands,  
subject to sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama Containing Eighty Acres, and Eleven and a Half Hundredths of an Acre -  
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-  
chased by the said John N. Hutton

**NOW KNOW YE,** That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the  
several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said John N. Hutton  
and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To  
Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said John  
N. Hutton and to his heirs and assigns forever.
