To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, Thomas Reeves of Greene County
 has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Thomas Reeves
 according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
 the South West quarter of the North West quarter of section thirty three, in Township twenty-
 three, of Range one West, in the district of lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama, con-
 taining thirty nine Acres and ninety three and a half hundredths of an Acre,
 according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
 chased by the said Thomas Reeves

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
 several acts of Congress, in such cases made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Thomas Reeves,

and to his heirs, the said tract above described:
 To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said
 Thomas Reeves
 and to his heirs and assigns forever.
