To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Nancy Hutton, of Greene County
 has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Nancy Hutton
 according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
 the South East quarter of section twenty five, in Township twenty three, of Range two
 West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama containing One
 hundred and fifty nine acres and ninety hundredths of an acre
 according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
 chased by the said Nancy Hutton

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
 several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Nancy
 Hutton and to her heirs, the said tract above described:
 To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said
 Nancy Hutton and to her heirs and assigns forever.

 affixed.
