CERTIFICATE

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS *Henry Johnson of Sumpter County, Alabama,*

has deposited in the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** of the United States, a Certificate of the REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE at *Tuscaloosa* whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said *Henry Johnson*

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the *Sot, or North West Fraction of Section thirty three, in Township twenty three of Range two West in the District of lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, containing one hundred and twenty nine acres, and seventy five hundredths of an acre*

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the **SURVEYOR GENERAL**, which said tract has been purchased by the said *Henry Johnson*

NOW KNOW YE, That the **United States of America**, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, **HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED**, and by these presents **DO GIVE AND GRANT**, unto the said *Henry Johnson*

and to *his* heirs, the said tract above described: **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said *Henry Johnson*

and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.
