To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS *Anderson Bonaway, of Chumpton County, Alabama,*

has deposited in the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** of the United States, a Certificate of the REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE at *Tuscaloosa,* whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said

Anderson Bonaway according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the East half of the North West quarter of Section twenty-three, in Township twenty three, of Range two West, in the District of lands subject to sale at *Tuscaloosa, Alabama,* containing eighty acres,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the **SURVEYOR GENERAL**, which said tract has been purchased by the said *Anderson Bonaway*

NOW KNOW YE, That the

United States of America, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, **HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED,** and by these presents **DO GIVE AND GRANT,** unto the said *Anderson Bonaway*

and to *his* heirs, the said tract above described **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said

Anderson Bonaway

and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, *I, Martin Van Buren* PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made **PATENT**, and the **SEAL** of the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** to be hereunto affixed.
