of Lands Subject to Sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama, Containing Eighty Acres, and Two Hundredths of an Acre—
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said *Solomon Gore*
and to his heirs, the said tract above described, To
Have, and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said *Solomon*
Gore and to his heirs and assigns forever.
