Whereas, James Vance of Pickens County
 has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said James Vance
 according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
 the East half of the North West quarter of Section Thirty two, in Township Twenty four of Range one
 East, in the District of Panas subject to Sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama, containing Eighty Acres, and
 Thirteen hundredths of an Acre,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
 chased by the said James Vance

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
 several acts of Congress, in such cases made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said James
 Vance and to his heirs, the said tract above described:
 To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said
 James Vance,
 and to his heirs and assigns forever.
