Whereas, Thomas I. Sammille of Pickens County
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Thomas I. Sammille
according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
the South East quarter of the South West quarter of Section Fifteen in Township Twenty four of Range one
East in the District of Land Subject to Sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama containing thirty nine Acres and thirty
four hundredths of an Acre
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-

several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Thomas

and to his heirs, the said tract above described:
To Have and to Hold, the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said
Thomas I. Sammille
and to his heirs and assigns forever.
