 according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 2d of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
 the North West quarter of the South West quarter of Section twelve, in Township twenty-four,
 of Range one, East, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama,
 containing thirty-nine acres and ninety-eight hundredths of an acre,
 according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-

 Samuel C. Johnson

and to his heirs and assigns forever.


