To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS *Turner Harrib, of Pickens County,*
Alabama,

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States, a Certificate of the REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE at *Tuskaloosa,* whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said *Turner Harrib,*

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the North West quarter of the South East quarter of Section twenty six, in Township twenty four, of Range one, East, in the District of Texas subject to sale at *Tuskaloosa, Alabama,* containing forty acres, and two and three fourth hundredths of an acre,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been purchased by the said *Turner Harrib*

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said *Turner Harrib,*

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said *Turner Harrib,*

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
