To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, Edward Lewis of Tuscaloosa County has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Edward Lewis according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the East half of the North quarter of section thirty-one in Township twenty-four, of Range the West, in the district of lands offered for sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama, containing seventy-five acres and eighty-seven and a half hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Edward Lewis.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted, and, by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Edward Lewis and to his heirs the said tract so described: To Have and to Hold, the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereto belonging, unto the said Edward Lewis and his heirs assigns.
