To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, Bowdon and Bradford assignees of Edward Sims
 have deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Edward Sims
 according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
 the East half of the South East quarter of section twenty-six, in township twenty
 four, of range one West, in the district of lands offered for sale at Tuscaloosa
 Alabama containing eighty acres
 according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
 chased by the said Edward Sims

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several
 acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted, and, by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Bowdon and Bradford
 and to their heirs the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appur-
 tenances, of whatsoever nature thereto belonging, unto the said Bowdon and Bradford
 and to their heirs and assigns forever, as tenants in common and not as joint tenants.

In testimony whereof, I, John Quincy Adams
 PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto
 affixed.
