To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, John Jones, of Green county,
 has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa,
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said John Jones,
 according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
 the West half of the North-West quarter of section thirty-one, in Township twenty-four,
 of Range one West, in the district of lands offered for sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama,
 containing seventy-nine acres, and eighty-seven and one half hundredths of an acre,
 according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
 chased by the said John Jones.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several
 acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said John Jones,
 and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To

Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said John Jones,
 and to his heirs and assigns forever

 affixed.
