 Seventy nine ~~two~~ acres, and eighty five hundredths of an acre
 according to the official plat of the survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
 chased by the said David Worsham

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several
 acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said David Worsham
 and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To
 Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said David
 Worsham and to his heirs and assigns forever
