according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for  
the south west quarter of the north west quarter of section twenty five, in township twenty four of range  
one west, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama containing forty acres

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-  
chased by the said Jacob Shamblee

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the  
several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Jacob Shamblee

To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said  
Jacob Shamblee and to his heirs, the said tract above described:  
and to his heirs and assigns forever.
