the East half of the South East quarter of Section twenty six in Township twenty four of Range two East in the District of Lands subject to Sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama containing seventy nine acres and ninety one hundredths of an acre.

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the **SURVEYOR GENERAL**, which said tract has been purchased by the said *Samuel Burton*

United States of America, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, **HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED**, and by these presents **DO GIVE AND GRANT**, unto the said *Samuel Burton*

and to *his* heirs, the said tract above described: **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said *Samuel*

and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.
