To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, a Certificate of the Assistant Commissioner is on file in the General Land Office, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress of May 20, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of the heirs of Ed Phillips has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section thirty-six in Township twenty-four north of Range three east of the St. Stephens Meridian, Alabama, containing thirty-nine acres and eight hundred seventy-five thousandths of an acre, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, on file in the General Land Office:

NOW KNOW YE, That there is, therefore, granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said heirs of Ed Phillips the tract of Land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said heirs of Ed Phillips and to their heirs and assigns forever. Excepting and reserving, however, to the United States all the oil and gas in the lands so patented, and to it, or persons authorized by it, the right to prospect for, mine, and remove such deposits from the same upon compliance with the conditions and subject to the provisions and limitations of the Act of July 17, 1914 (38 Stat. 509).
