Whereas Thomas Means of Green County

has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Thomas Means

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
the South West quarter of the South West quarter of Section Thirty two, in Town-

Alabama containing thirty nine acres and ninety seven and three fourths hundredths of an acre
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-

several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said
Thomas Means and to his heirs the said tract above described:
and to his heirs and assigns forever.
